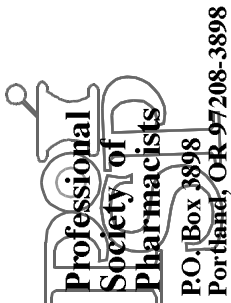

Speakers

Officer Mike Jones is a Portland Police Bureau narcotics investigator. He received his bachelor's from Cal State Long Beach and a master's degree in criminalistics from Cal State LA. He is an 11 year veteran of the Portland Police Bureau and a narcotics investigator for 4 years.

Matthew Ito, PharmD, FCCP, CLS, FNLA is professor of pharmacy practice at OSU/OHSU College of Pharmacy. He got the pharmD at USC as well as a post-doctorate residency and fellowship. He has done extensive research in lipid modifying agents' effects on endothelial dysfunction and clinical outcomes.

Kristan Collins has been a pediatrician at the Broadway Medical Clinic since 1991. She did premed at Austin College in Sherman, TX and received her MD plus a residency in pediatrics at Baylor College of Medicine. She completed a fellowship in adolescent medicine at Texas Children's Hospital in Houston.

Luis Valls has a PhD in molecular and cellular biology from the University of Oregon and received his MD from Univ of Missouri. He completed his internal medicine residency at OHSU. He has been an internist at the Broadway Medical Clinic in Portland since 1997 and his emphasis is on cardiovascular disease and sports medicine.

Laurie Skokan completed undergraduate work at Washington Univ in St.Louis and earned her doctorate in health research and health administration from UCLA. She has been with Providence Health & Services for 15 years and is currently the director of quality, data, and integrative medicine at the Providence Cancer Center.

Jeff Fortner graduated pharmD from OSU and has worked as pharmacy manager for Fred Meyer. He is Assistant Professor at Pacific Univ School of Pharmacy and also maintains a clinical practice in community practice.

Becky Shipman is the academic coordinator of experiential education at the School of Pharmacy, Pacific Univ. She previously was the lead instructor for Clark College pharmacy technician training program.

Richard Leman is the Medical Epidemiologist in Acute and Communicable Disease Prevention, Oregon Public Health Division, Dept of Human Services. He is board certified in family practice and previously worked with Multnomah County Health Division and Siletz Community Health Clinic.
